During Lent, we enter into a season of preparation, self-reflection and repentance when we seek to literally "turn around" and realign our lives and focus toward God. It is a time to give up things as well as take on new life-giving practices, helping us rid ourselves of distractions and our own selfish desires. By doing so, we seek to live and love as more faithful disciples of Jesus Christ.

The <u>Easter Season</u>, also known as Eastertide or the Great Fifty Days, begins on Easter Day and ends on <u>Pentecost</u>. Focusing on Christ's resurrection and ascension and the sending of the Holy Spirit (Pentecost), Eastertide is the most joyous and celebrative season of the Christian year. 

He left and I was watering the two new tomato plants and I noticed the dove sitting on the Memorial Table at Ben Seay's Memorial area. The dove was so peaceful and relaxed and just enjoying the garden. You know me, I quietly went and got my cell phone and got some precious pictures of that dove.

If you look at the garden, you'll see the weeding and trimming is getting under control. The Fire Bush trees will need trimming soon, The Vanda Orchids are beautiful. The fish weren't biting that afternoon; I tried cast after cast into the lake that lay three feet below the wooden dock behind my grandmother's retirement community. The wood was greyed and splintered from years of sun and water. Several boats were rocking gently in their slips under the tin roof that protected them from the elements. My fourteen-year-old mind was deep into planning fishing strategy, trying to divine the location of the fish and what presentation would entice them to strike my lure, when I heard footsteps on the boards and looked up to see a gentleman from the community walking toward me.

"How is the fishing?" He asked. "Not going so good." I replied.

He walked around on the dock, surveying the water and listening to the birds. The breeze was tussling the grey hair on his head. I don't recall how it happened, but we started talking about God. After about five minutes he asked a question, "Do you know the name of God?"

I didn't. I just knew God as "God".

He gently informed me that the name of God was mentioned several times in the Bible.

He didn't stay long. He wished me well and strolled back toward the retirement community- without telling me what my mind wanted to know, the name of God.

I never saw him again. But he did ignite a spark in me that started a quest to learn the name of God. I had read the Bible before, but that day I started a cover to cover search for the name of God. I discovered the answer, and so much more, as I completed the page by page journey from Genesis to Revelation over the course of several years.

The gentleman on the dock never knew the impact he had with that one simple question. That question was the catalyst that started my journey into ministry.

You have the same power to impact the teenagers around you. A story, a question, a smile; they all make a greater impression than you may think.

At times teenagers may make you feel like you are being ignored. I encourage you to stay at the doorstep of their lives, letting them know they matter, and thanking God for the times when they open the door and let you in.
