Here are some things I would like for Community's members and friends to do.

Create a small group of fellow members or friends, at least 3-5. Collect each other's contact information. Have one person be the contact for your group. Submit your list to the church office. We at the church will make a list that you can call to get assistance. <u>Yes, we'll send our list out to you</u>. This will give us a network to contact your group, see if everyone is OK, and if they need anything during a crisis, any crisis.

If you cannot stay where you live, make a reservation with a hosting family. NOW is the time to do this. Keep your group leader informed.

I want to encourage everyone to make a plan of action. This plan would let us know your location during a storm/crisis.

**SUPPLIES**: This is a good time to stock up on items you will need: water, food supply, batteries, MEDICATIONS for the next few months, and let's not forget our pets.

The plan is, just get a little bit every time you do your shopping, and in a few weeks you will be set.

If you own a generator now is the time to verify that it will work. Get it serviced if needed.

Remember those **SHUTTERS**. Are they ready to go? Do they need repair? Do you have all the parts to install them? (screws, bolts, etc.) Do you need assistance for installation and removal? Let us know so we at the church can make a list of those who need this assistance.

Thanks for reading this. I know there are big lists out there, but what I mentioned above will give us all a head start, so we to can help others.

Remember as a church, you and me, WE can do great things together.

#### GOSPEL GARDENER GOD'S ACCURACY

This article was given to me in 2015 and I think it belongs in our Gospel Gardener. God is creating miracles every day in our Church Gardens and in our lives every day.

One may observe God's accuracy in the hatching of eggs ... Those of the canary in 14 days; those of the barnyard hen in 21 days; eggs of ducks and geese in 28 days; those of the mallard in 35 days; the eggs of the parrot and the ostrich hatch in 42 days. All these are divisible by seven, the number of days in a week!

See God's wisdom in the making of an elephant ... The four legs of this great beast all bend forward in the same direction. No other quadruped is so made. God planned that this animal would have a huge body - too large to live on two legs. For this reason He gave it four fulcrums so that it can rise from the ground easily. The horse rises from the ground on its two front legs first. A cow rises from the ground on its two hind legs first.

How wise the Lord is in all His works of creation! Each watermelon has an even number of stripes on the rind. Each orange has an even number of rows. Each stalk of wheat has an even number of grains. All grains are found in even numbers on the stalks. Every bunch of bananas has on its lowest row an even number of bananas, and each row decreases by one, so that one row has an even number and the next row an odd number. The waves of the sea roll in on shore twenty-six to the minute in all kinds of weather.

God has caused the flowers to blossom at certain specified times during the day. Linnaeus, a great botanist, once said that if he had a conservatory that contained the right kind of soil, moisture, and temperature, he could tell the time of day or night by the flowers that were open and those that were closed.

The lives of each of us may be ordered by the Lord in a beautiful way for His glory, if we will entrust Him with our lives. He made our brains and hearts and can successfully guide them to a profitable end. Life without God is like an unsharpened pencil - it has no point. God created us in His perfect plan.

## **GIVING OPPORTUNITIES**

**ONLINE GIVING IS NOW AVAILABLE** through ProPay and Center State Bank. This allows donations to be deposited directly into Community's account, using a computer, tablet, or mobile phone.

ProPay expands the ways to give with an "electronic transfer of funds". This can be done using a <u>credit card</u>, <u>debit card</u>, or "<u>ACH</u>".

There is a charge for using a card.

MasterCard, VISA, Discover, and American Express have a 2.95% fee.

A debit card has a "flat fee" of \$4.95. This is more cost effective on a large donation.

<u>There is NO charge for an ACH</u>. (ACH stands for Automated Clearing House for money transfers. It moves money between banks without using paper checks.)
